

THE ASSEMBLY GATHERED IN THE MEETING HOUSE IS NOT

a place for "sour grapes." We live in a day where everyone is in the crosshairs of motivators. Many make a living teaching others how to motivate someone. It happens between husbands and wives, parents and kids or their teens; with friends. Companies use all sorts of motivators trying to get the best out of their employees. Volunteer groups spend considerable effort on marketing to gain some sort of voice above all the other voices. You will be the target of some act or process planned out to provide something that causes you to act in a certain way. At times we may sense it's more like manipulation rather than motivation. But in our current culture it can be a debilitating pressure on some to act according to someone else's viewpoint. It can even be found in the Church of Jesus. It can be illegitimate and ungodly. Or could it be that what we're interpreting as unfair manipulation is really God's plan for His called out community? Could a motivational call for everyone's benefit be misconstrued? Sound strange? Maybe even unchristian? I mean being told to deny yourself is definitely un-loving, right? Take a look at this verse:

Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do,

but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near. Hebrews 10:24-25(NLT)

This verse clearly says that thought is to be put into motivating other believers to act. Motivating them to act through love and do good works. Not work for good people or work for personal gain but for the benefit of others. But the interesting thing is that the root word in Greek "to motivate" is the word for "sour grapes." Depending on the context the same word for motivate can also mean to "stir to anger, to be provoked, irritated. For example in Acts 17:16 Paul preaches because he's angry about the idolatry being practiced in Corinth. He's not preaching because of his call is to preach the Good News to them. In Acts 15:39 Paul and Barnabas got so irritated over another companion that they could no longer minister together. They could not get over their "sharp disagreement" (sour grapes) about Mark, so they went their separate ways!

Our verses are not instructing us to use "sharp disagreement or irritation" but in thoughtful consideration of each other in love, we're to rouse or encourage each other to act. It's not a "measure up" message but a "take the next step" message that we're to share with each other. It is about strengthening each other in an upward looking,

growing in faithfulness journey towards our corporate meeting with Jesus! Rather than being about personal benefit with we are to be about the other's benefit. Gathering takes on a very different reality when I'm coming to walk along side you. The call here is that my perspective be for your benefit. That my thoughts are directed in studying how to help you go with Christ. Sounds wonderfully romantic or "pie in the sky" and not truly possible. Yet it is the Words of the Spirit to us today. In whatever ways previous generations of FBC lived this out it is now up to us. We thank God for their past success as it lays a solid foundation for us to build on today. But our building must be in a faith that works through love. For some, our current culture of entitlement and selfishness often incapacitates their desire to personally demonstrate practical love for neighbor. It is easy at times to find ourselves like those religious leaders who asked Jesus, "who is my neighbor?" We've all made an intellectual excuse as to why that "samaritan" was not my neighbor.

We gather at First Baptist because we've been given a mandate - go into every area of our community. It is His will that we go as well into the communities

around us and make disciples for Jesus. We're not called to for Jesus. We're not called to make members of First Baptist, we're told to make disciples of Jesus Christ. God will hold those here that He chooses for stability of this Baptist church as long as our goal is His goal - making disciples throughout the whole world. When our purpose is to make baptists or keep the church doors open, He will not bless our efforts. As we begin the second month of a new year in ministry together let's purpose to think hard, consider carefully one another and how we can encourage each other to "take the next step" in love and good works. Asking ourselves: what does God want me to invest in my sister or brother? My neighbor in the next pew or across the street. Let's make this our prayer: "Father help me to do today what You want to bless! God, I know you're going to do some very exciting things in the world today. Would you give me the privilege of just being in on some of them? I just want to be in on what you're doing. I want to do what you're blessing. I want to be used to motivate others in love and good works today!"

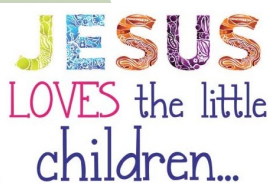

Show and Share

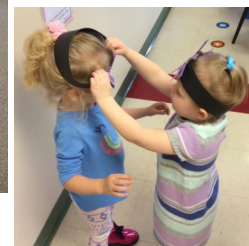
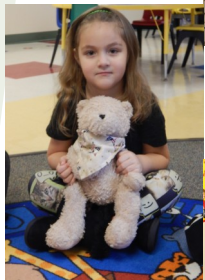

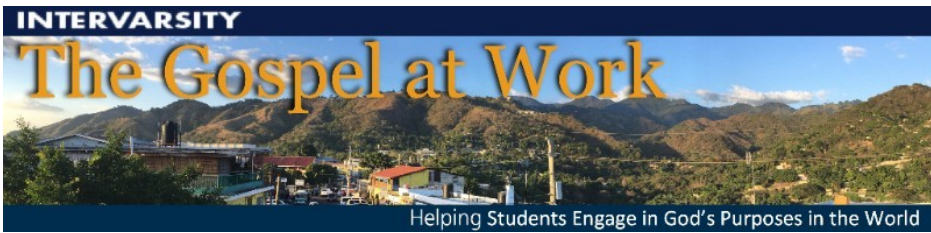

I love opportunities to work face-to-face with students and "Compelling" did not disappoint - 28 students made a commitment to follow Jesus that weekend! I spent the remainder of that week traveling to a few different schools in mid-Michigan helping them think about how God might want to use international missions to transform them and their fellowships. Two of those three schools are planning to send students overseas this school year!

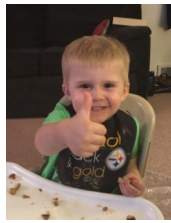
Since students don't have the capacity to support this work, we

depend on prayerful people like you who, through their giving, send us out to use the gifts God has given us. That is, we need you and all that you bring to this partnership. We firmly believe that we are able to accomplish more together than any of us can on our own. Through our partnership, more students are choosing to follow Jesus, and taking costly steps of faith into international cross-cultural ministry. Through our partnership, we're unleashing wise, sensitive and thoughtful women and men into a globalized society with the skills to navigate it, as well as the ability to communicate the gospel across cultural differences. This matters in our world, and particularly in the Kingdom of God.

This school year, I have had to spend significantly more time away from my work and focused on fundraising, due both to my deficit (currently \$1300) as well as my hope to receive my full salary. Most years, I've spent months trying to close the gap in our funding - sometimes successfully, other times not. Without a doubt, God has been faithful and met all of our needs, even if we haven't been fully-funded. However, I want to ask you to imagine what else God might accomplish through us if I could reallocate that time to face-to-face ministry, as opposed to fundraising. I would like to erase this deficit, receive my full salary, and be freed to invest further in these missions programs and the relationships that sustain them. Will you give a year-end gift of \$100, \$200 or \$500 to help me accomplish this?

Thank you considering our request and for the many ways that you have loved us and encouraged us this year - your prayers, messages and sacrificial giving. It means so much to us to see our family and friends joining us in this meaningful and transformative ministry. Our prayer for you, as for our family, is that the giving and receiving of Christmas would fill you with joy, reminding you why we do any of this to begin with.

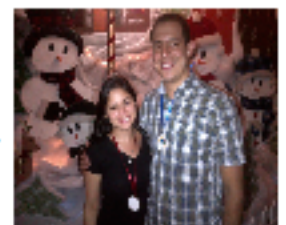
