Pastor's Corner

DURING FEBRUARY I'VE **BEEN IN A SERIES ENTITLED** "DONE ENOUGH YET?"

In my message on Sunday February 19th I mentioned the need for a teaching strategy that goes beyond putting a plague of the Ten Commandments on a wall (you can listen here). As parents and a Congregation attempting to support our families we need a strategy to invest Biblical truth in our children. If we're going to help them live out their Hope in and beyond College, then we must strategize and execute a plan so that Bible knowledge goes beyond their heads and becomes established in their hearts. Our influence during their formative years passes quickly. The reason I spoke seemingly in a negative way about having the Ten Commandments placed on the wall alone is because as a visual strategy it is incomplete. Why? Because it included decrees, commands, instructions and statutes. Through all of those the Lord declared how their relationship with Him would work and provided glimpses into His nature and character. Although it is common to think of the Law as limited to the Ten Commandments. Actually, it was comprised of regula-

tions for worship, instructions on legal matters, principles for society, edicts for sexual conduct and more. When obeyed, the Law was a path to fruitful life (Leviticus 18:4-5). The Lord made it clear that His laws were not negotiable. He expected unconditional obedience. Those refusing to listen to Him and carry out all of His commands would be met with divine anger, overwhelming cost and the realization that God would always get His way (Lev 26:14 - 39).

The Law is much more than a set of restrictions. It governed the Old Testament system of sacrifices which were the mechanisms for maintaining a right standing with God. Yet it was only a shadow of the superior sacrifice Jesus made when He came to earth to redeem us from the guilt of our sins. In His death, Jesus set aside the first way and paved a new way by providing the perfect, ultimate sacrifice of Himself once and for all. Men and women are now made holy through faith in His sacrifice and resurrection (Hebrews 10:1-10). This helps us understand Jesus' words when He said

that He did not come to abolish the Law but to complete it (Matthew 5:17).

Since a strategy is so vital we've adopted the Orange program as the backbone of our children's and student teaching materials here at FBC. My prayer is that our parents are using the weekly parent cues and homework we send home with your kids and students to help you with that strategy. Recently, I've discovered an additional "voice" to help you. I've included it in this month's Briefs. Jeff Anderson is a pastor/blogger that presents an at home strategy that I think has some great. I hope it will give you some added help. The material is really well done and clearly thought through. Actually, it is so clear that I think it will help all of our adult readers as well. So whether you're retired, an empty-nester, still raising children or single, I think you'll be blessed by his thoughts.

PILLAR #1 WE NEED THE BIG PICTURE

In my previous post, I noted two concerning, and connected, trends:

- 1 Young people walking away from faith
- 2 Biblical literacy dramatically declining among young people (and adults)

As promised, this is the first of five pillars to teach your family. That means five ways to I know. This is so simple it's crazy that it help your family grow up to understand truth, and to walk more confidently in the faith.

No Gimmicks

These are not five magic solutions to raising kids. Transferring faith is a multi-faceted process that is influenced by a wide range of factors, like:

- Church, Culture
- Child's freewill
- God's sovereignty
- Prayer

And of course, Parenting

And under the Parenting category, there's our own Spiritual Modeling. And the one we're focused on in this series - Biblical teaching.

Pillar #1 - Youth need the big-picture

even needs mentioning. But it does. Youth need to know the basic narrative of the faith. They need the big picture. What's the overall runs from Genesis to Revelation?

What's the 30,000-foot perspective that allowed the Christian religion to survive and thrive for the past 2,000 years?

Among the evidences of declining biblical literacy is the fact of basic articulation. Most kids today can't articulate their faith. They

might be able to recite the sinner's prayer, their date of baptism, and maybe even some landmark Bible stories. Before smart phones. they might have rattled off the books of the Bible. But when it comes to grasping the big picture, and relating it back in their own words, they go blank.

Getting the big picture is crucial to any discipline in life.

When I share the sex talk with my children, I don't use "birds and bees." I talk specifically about the "seed." The seed from a mommy and a daddy, that results in a baby.

I've found the "seed" to be helpful tool when I want to transition to talking about the Bible. A launch pad for the big-picture Bible discussion is Genesis 3:15. The verse tells about the seed of a woman that will one day rock the enemy and save the world.

For 4,000 years this seed worked it's way through the human race. Eventually a baby Messiah was born. For a season, which continues even into today, this seed has been pestered by the snake (Satan) nipping at the ankles. But in the end, this seed (Christ) will crush Satan's head.

It's a grander story than could be scripted by any Hollywood sci-fi movie.

Building the narrative

4.000 Years:

> The biblical accounts are there to link The Seed from Genesis 3:15 to John 3:16 (God's Son sent to die for the world). Consider these ways various Bible accounts help us understand the role of The Seed.

- Why did God save one man's family (Noah) from the flood? [Answer: To keep The Seed alive]
- What's so significant about Abraham being asked to sacrifice his son, Isaac [Answer: that meant killing the path of The Seed that would lead to Christ]
- Why the weird story of Judah having sex with his daughter-in-law Tamar who posed as a prostitute [Answer: she carries The Seed in the line of Christ – shocking,
- · What's so special about the story of Ruth? [Answer: she marries Boaz, the great grandfather to King David – also ancestor to Christ]

Bible stories are important. I recommend sharing as many as you can with your chil-

The problem is, kids learn them with no context for how they relate to the big picture. As parents, we can help their understanding by linking these stories to The Seed.

There are five key events God uses to pave the path for The Seed. Interestingly, these five events are marked by a special conversation with God. I call them "resets" because of how these events reset the direction for The Seed to travel.

1. God speaks to Satan in the garden, in the presence of Adam and Eve.

After Adam and Even ate the forbidden fruit. man was flawed and death entered the scene. But God had a solution, saying to Satan, "GAME ON! Your fate is sealed. I'm going to crush you.... With a special seed." (Jeff's paraphrase)

2. God speaks to Noah of plans to destroy the earth by flood.

Angels were procreating with humans, (no kidding - you can read about it in Genesis 6). So God started over with one family. NEW BEGINNINGS for mankind. The previous human race was contaminated with angelic seed. (I promise, your kids will get this more than you think. It's us adults that act weird about these truths.)

3. God speaks to Abraham of plans to give him and his wife, Sarah, a son.

As wickedness spread across the earth again, the seed was once again at risk. So God launched a NEW NATION (called Israel) and a safer path for routing The Seed.

4. God tells Moses of plans to deliver the Israelites out of Egypt.

The Israelites found themselves in slavery. Not good for The Seed. To keep The Seed safe, God provided an escape from slavery and separation from their enemies. He established a NEW ORDER for this new nation by which to live (i.e. new laws, new land, new government, new tabernacle, new code of worship, etc.)

5. God tells the virgin, Mary, that she will have a child.

Instead of a seed from a man, it would be a Holy Spirit Seed. Finally a NEW ADAM (i.e. the baby Jesus who grew up as a child, walked the earth as a perfect man, and offered himself as a sacrifice to God.)

Two redemptive events:

Two climactic, redemptive events are integral to the overall biblical narrative.

The redemption of man: Jesus came to earth to be sacrificed as the Lamb of God, to redeem fallen man. Three days after his cross crucifixion, Jesus was resurrected from

the dead. Those who place their complete trust and belief in Him will have their names written in the Lamb's Book of Life and have eternal life. They too will one day experience a bodily resurrection.

Renewal of the heavens and earth: This event lies ahead of us, following the final judgment and destruction of Satan, his angels, and all those whose names are not written in the Book of Life.



22 Things Christians Need To Stop Doing...Now!



But there are also other things that we should seek to cease in our lives. Here, Chuck Tate at Charisma magazine gives us 22 key things and attitudes that we need to cut out of our lives.

- 1. Quit expecting the world to like you. Jesus said it would hate you (John 15:18-27, Matthew 10:22).
- 2. Quit throwing your own teammates mand. Go already (Matthew 28:19, Mark 16. Quit criticizing loving believers who under the bus. "We're called to build each 16:15)." other up, not tear each other down. In fact, Jesus said that our love for each other proves to the world that we are really His true disciples (John 13:35, 1 Thessalonians 5:11)."
- "juicy prayer requests" with no intention of actually praying (Psalms 34:13, Psalms 101:5, Ephesians 4:29).
- 4. Quit replacing prayer with "good vibes" and "positive thoughts." No. Just no. Prayer moves the hand of God and the hand of God moves the world. "Prayer is much more effective than making someone feel warm and fuzzy inside. By the way, I'm not saying positive thoughts and good vibes are wrong (and they do make you feel good), I'm just saying prayer trumps them both (2) Corinthians 1:11, Philippians 1:19, Ephesians 6:18, James 5:16)."
- 5. Quit saying repentance isn't necessary. It is. Jesus said so. "And just so you know, there are 53 references to repentance in the New Testament. Now go repent (Matthew 5:17, Acts 3:19, Romans 2:5, 2 Peter 3:9, 1 John 1:9)."
- 6. Quit saying that the "portions of the Bible that make you feel uncomfortable" are irrelevant and nothing more than dated writings. "All 66 books, 1,189 chapters, and 31,102 verse are the inspired Word of God. So the next time you think about throwing out the Old Testament, just remember

- Quit expecting unbelievers/non-Christians to understand the Bible and/or to live like Christ. "It's hard enough for Christians to live like Christ and it's impossible to do so without Him (until the blinders are removed) (2 Corinthians 4:4, 2 Corinthians 5:17, Galatians 5:24-25)."
- 8. Quit acting like the Great Commission (Go into all the world to preach the gospel) is the Great Suggestion. "It's a com-
- 9. Quit thinking that it's OK to be silent about your faith. "Yes, it's just as important to represent Jesus by how we live, but someone can't respond to the Good News without hearing it ... and they can't hear it if 17. Quit pointing out the speck in your 3. 

From time to time, I'd like to share stories of Global Program alumni, to help you understand the kind of impact these programs have on those who participate. We'll start this time with Bekah's story.

"During the summer of 2012, I joined InterVarsity for a Global Program in Santa Cruz, Bolivia. Among many impactful moments, our week working at a Christian camp for the Ayoré, a marginalized people group, stood out the most. My heart was touched and ignited with fire when I interacted with children who were in the throes of poverty and struggling to have basic needs met. They were starving for love, hungering for people to stop for them, to tell them that they matter and that

their lives have purpose. There was one sweet girl in particular that week who got my attention. I prayed for direction on how best to minister to her and sensed Father God whispering, "Just love her." That week I intentionally sought this girl out and loved her. The transformation was dramatic. She went from being a detached, unemotional child to sitting on my lap, allowing me to talk to her, and receiving the Father's love. It's amazing what the Holy Spirit can do with willing hearts! After that week, my heart couldn't stop beating for the hurting and I knew that my life would look different.

Saying yes to Bolivia set the stage for future ministry. I later accepted a one year teaching position in Honduras, and then a position in a bilingual classroom in the US. I recently returned from three months in Mozambique (photo above) with the ministry Iris Global and am praying about next steps. My simple yes led me all over the world and now leads me around my community. Saying yes to Jesus is always the best yes. He writes the best chapters. Each one of us is a missionary; each one of us has people in our lives that need to be touched with the Father's love. 
